

AFTERSCHOOL

The Afterschool Program is structured into two sessions, 2:30 – 3:30PM and 3:35 – 4:45PM following the 2:15-2:30PM Afterschool Transition/Break in the Cafeteria. Students may stay after for the first session or both.

1. A **Completed [Afterschool Registration Form](#)** (Student FCPS Google Account) is required prior to participation. *Students may not return for participation, Late Bus transportation, or pick-up after leaving campus. Students should not be on their phones during Afterschool without Staff permission – if they need to communicate with parents/care-givers they should let an adult know.*
2. **Students** are required to complete the **Afterschool Attendance** Form each afternoon they stay after.

College Partnership Program Application

Do you have a student between grades 8 through 11 who wants to go to college? If so, they should consider applying to the College Partnership Program (CPP), which offers support as

students explore the idea of going to college! **The deadline to apply was extended to March 22, 2024.**

CPP offers programming to help prepare students and families from 9th grade all the way through applying to and enrolling in college, including:

- Academic counseling
- College visits
- Help with completing college and scholarship applications
- Monthly meetings
- Parent education sessions
- SAT preparation classes
- A summer overnight experience on a college campus
- News and information related to colleges and careers via Schoology

All students are eligible and encouraged to apply to this program, and are expected to meet the following requirements:

- Maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher in core classes
- Attend CPP activities
- Are willing to pursue advanced coursework
- Demonstrate leadership in school or community activities

The goal of the program is to systematically mitigate the impact of barriers to access and opportunity, and support students who are from populations that are historically underrepresented on college campuses. This includes students who are the first in their family to attend college in the U.S., English language learners, students who are economically disadvantaged, and students with disabilities.

Accepted participants will receive a confirmation letter/email along with further camp instructions. **Payment will be due after receiving confirmation of acceptance and no later than Wednesday, June 12.** *Contact the After-School Program Specialist with payment concerns.*
