What Makes IB Distinct?

- Comprehensive, internationally-minded curriculum
- International standards, applied equally to all schools
- IB-trained faculty
- Variety of rigorous assessments
- Breadth and depth in and outside the classroom
- Emphasizes applying critical and compassionate thinking
- Students write college-level papers in almost all IB course









Beyond Marshall

- IB offers exposure to and experience with academic rigor, leading to college readiness and success
- Colleges and universities often award college credit for IB courses
 - IB Diploma essential for admission to post-secondary education overseas







IB Diploma Candidates

- Students take IB courses and complete assessments in six academic disciplines during the 11th and 12th grades
- Complete Theory of Knowledge seminar, Extended Essay, and CAS Program (each component spanning 11th and 12th grades, "concurrent" to the 6 Diploma Subjects)









Theory of Knowledge

Explores the nature of knowledge across disciplines

Encourages an appreciation of other cultural perspectives



Meets during the 2nd semester of Junior year and the 1st semester of Senior year.



Extended Essay

Opportunity to investigate a research question of individual interest

Faculty-supervised

University-level research and writing

By the Numbers

- Nearly 100% of the Class of 2025 will take an IB Course with an IB Exam while at GCM
- Approximately 20-25% of the senior class earns the IB Diploma
 - Typically the average GCM IB scores exceeded the world average



GCM IB Support

Every Diploma Candidate makes an individual academic, CAS, and EE plan with the Coordinators

LEARN: 4 days a week for remediation and enrichment

Honors coursework introduces IB expectations in Grades 9 and 10

Strong peer networks

IB classes abide by 504/IEP accommodations; accommodations available for IB assessments





Next Steps for rising 8th

To keep the <u>most</u> options open, middle school students should:

- take Algebra 1
- take Level 1 of French, Mandarin, or Spanish



enroll in Honors-level classes

<u>Didn't</u> do one/all of the above? It is still possible to participate in the IB Diploma program.



Next Steps for rising 9th

Rising freshmen:

- Enroll in Honors courses
- Maintain enrollment in world language
- Begin fine arts prerequisite (music, theatre, visual art) if considering IB Arts
 - Get involved (clubs, sports, etc.)
