

- 150 students
- Classes generally close in proximity
- Students are placed on a team based on their course requests
- Two School Counselors & Grade Level
 Assistant Principal support each team

Honors Classes

- Open enrollment: students and families self-select classes in areas of strength or interest
- Increased depth and complexity in specific subject areas
- Students learn with other students who have chosen to be challenged academically in that subject area
- Students may enroll in 1, 2, 3, or 4 Honors courses
- Offered in all middle schools

Full-Time AAP Services

- Students are found eligible through central screening process
- Increased depth, complexity, and pace in all subjects
- Students identified as having high intellectual ability are clustered in classes with peers
- Students are in advanced classes for all 4 core subject areas (math class is based on readiness)
- 14 schools are designated as centers

Math Course Options

Mathematics 7

7th grade standards

Mathematics 7 Honors

Pre-Algebra (Math 8 standards) + extensions (Open access)

Algebra I Honors criteria:


- Advanced Math in 6th grade,
- 500+ on 7th grade SOL, and
- 91st percentile on Iowa Algebra Aptitude Test

(Algebra I is a high school credit course.)

Math Course Options

- Math 7 a curriculum which considers the foundations of Algebra and emphasizes the concept of and operations with rational numbers. The content covers the Math 7 SOLs.
- Math 7 Honors A more rigorous approach to a pre-algebra curriculum with an emphasis on problem solving. It is correlated to the 8th grade Math SOLs, but contains extensions and enrichment opportunities. Best prepares students for Algebra I Honors or Algebra 1 in grade 8.
- Algebra I Honors A fast-paced approach to Algebra I, a high school credit course, which includes many extensions to the Algebra I SOLs.

Academic Support

- We offer academic support classes focused on reading and math.
- These courses are included in a student's schedule in place of a semester or year long elective.
- Parents are notified over the summer if their child has been identified to receive additional academic support.
- Students are considered for placement at the start of the school year and again at the beginning of the second semester.



Planning Ahead:

Marshall HS IB Program

- Students have the opportunity to earn an IB Diploma in addition to a standard or advanced high school diploma.
- IB courses provide increased exposure to academic rigor, fostering college readiness and success.
- To maximize their options in high school, middle school students should aim to complete <u>Algebra 1</u>, their first world language course, and <u>at least one honors</u> course by the end of eighth grade.

Course Selection for 7th Grade

Before Selecting Courses:

- Join us for our Rising 7th Grade Open House tomorrow evening from 5–7 PM!
- Following the open house, parents will receive an email with links to our curriculum website, course catalog, and a list of seventh grade course options.
- We encourage families to seek feedback from 6th grade teachers to help select courses that align with each student's academic strengths and abilities.

Which course is best for vou?

Consider the following questions when deciding whether to take an honors course:

- Which subjects are you doing well in this school year?
- Are you willing to put in the effort to strengthen your skills and to prepare for an honors course next year?
- Which subject do you enjoy the most?
- How will the courses you select support your goals for both middle school and high school?"

Selecting Courses StudentVUE

- Kilmer school counselors and 6th grade teachers will guide students through the course selection process in SIS StudentVUE.
- Students will use the list of 7th grade courses as a reference when entering their choices in StudentVUE.
- Students will rank their top elective preferences from 1 to 6.
- Students are encouraged to select courses that align with their academic strengths, interests, and abilities

After Selecting Courses

- Student course requests will be viewable in SIS StudentVUE and SIS ParentVUE.
- If you have questions about your child's course requests after March 1, please reach out to a Kilmer school counselor.
- The deadline for course request changes is June 1.
- Students who qualify for Algebra 1 HN will receive notification in July.
- Final student schedules will be available in SIS StudentVUE and ParentVUE on the Thursday before the start of the school year.

A message from Principal Steven McFarlane




Kilmer Community,

This week I was reminded of how middle school students meet expectations when we clearly define the standard, support them along the way, and hold them accountable. A few weeks ago, we began implementing Tardy Sweeps (unannounced) to ensure our students get to class on time and ready to learn. I'm happy to report that most of our Tardy Sweeps (again, these are unannounced) result in ZERO students being tardy. In a school of 1,200 students, this is a great accomplishment. I'm proud of our students and their commitment to doing the right thing, and being ready to learn!

This past Tuesday, members of FCPS's Senior Leadership Team came to Kilmer to conduct Instructional Rounds. Senior Leadership is visiting schools throughout the county this year to align themselves around instructional practices. We were excited to be selected as one of the host schools. The Leadership Team was excited to see Kilmer teachers and students in action as they visited a total of sixteen classrooms across both grade levels.
